

Living Rock Church Reopening FAQ

When will Living Rock Reopen?

We plan to host our first in-person service starting Sunday June 7th.

How many people can attend the service?

We have created enough distance with our seating in our current sanctuary and the “overflow” fellowship hall to allow enough space for all regular attendees to come and worship with us while still practicing safe social distancing. Our overflow room will have a livestream of the service playing.

What is Living Rock doing to ensure our space is clean and safe?

In between services every week the church will receive its normal intensive cleaning with an additional disinfecting step. We will also try to minimize “touch” points in the church by removing the bibles from the chairs, propping open most doors, and limiting access to certain areas of the church. Lastly, we will have masks and hand sanitizer available at the door and throughout the church.

Are masks required during the service?

Though masks are encouraged they are not required.

What should I do if I am sick or a “high risk” person?

If any individual is sick or experiencing symptoms, we kindly request they and their household refrain from joining us for worship. For those people in “high risk” categories we encourage you to worship with us through facebook livestream but will not require you stay home.

What is the seating like in the church?

We have spread chairs out in the sanctuary and moved some additional seating into the fellowship hall to allow for social distancing during the service.

Can kids come to the service?

Yes, kids and families are allowed to come to the service but please note we will not be offering nursery or kids rock during the service. We will have coloring packets available but ask that you bring your own crayons/colored pencils to reduce touch points. The nursing moms room and nursery will still be available but will not be staffed.

Can I still get my cup of coffee and donut before the service?

For the time being we are suspending all hospitality services before and after the service to limit touch points and interaction between our members. We ask that you find your way to your seat when you arrive and after the service please make your way to the door without congregating.

Can I still worship from home?

Absolutely, we will continue to host a facebook livestream every Sunday at 10:30 am and our service will also be aired on Luverne's local channel 3 at 1:30 pm on Sunday and 2:00 pm on Thursdays.

Lastly, we just want to take a moment to say thanks to all our members during this time for your patience and understanding as we try to slowly reopen the church. We want to continue to worship together while still following national and state recommendation for gatherings to keep our people as safe as possible. We love you all and are excited to get back to our normal Sunday worship.
